Child Safeguarding Statement

PRINCIPLES TO SAFEGUARD CHILDREN FROM HARM

This statement recognises that in accordance with legislation and with the requirements of our Codes and Rules that the welfare and interests of children are paramount in all circumstances.

It aims to ensure that all children and young people have a positive, developmental and enjoyable experience of Snooker & Billiards when participating in a safe and controlled environment.

PROCEDURES

Our Child Safeguarding Statement has been prepared in accordance with the legislative requirements contained in the Children First Act 2015.

Children's First: National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children (2017).

Tusla's Child Safeguarding: A Guide for Policy, Procedure and Practice as required by RIBSA rules.

The following procedures contained in our risk assessment support our intention to safeguard children while they are availing of our services.

- Procedure in respect to the management of allegations of abuse against any member, non-member, staff or volunteer of a child availing of our services.
- Procedure for the safe recruitment and selection of workers and volunteers to work with children and young people
- Procedure for provision of and access to RIBSA child safeguarding training and information, including the identification of the occurrence of harm.
- Procedure for the reporting of child protection or welfare concerns to the Association and/or Tusla as applicable.
- Procedure for appointing a relevant person i.e. the National Children's Officer, who is the relevant person for the purpose of this statement (see name below)
